To attend SAILL classes, lifelong learners must be a current member of USS, unless a sponsored lecture or course specifies otherwise.

Be aware that most courses have fees to participate; supplies can be an extra cost as specified by the instructor.

Fees are due at the time of registration, payable by cash, check, or credit card.

There is a catalog of courses for each term that is released prior to a scheduled beginning of registration date. Enrollment in SAILL classes is on a first-come, first-served basis. If the class is full, you may request to be placed on a waiting list.

Refunds may only be requested prior to the first week of class.

Limited scholarship assistance is available (upon request) to help cover the cost of class registration fees.
